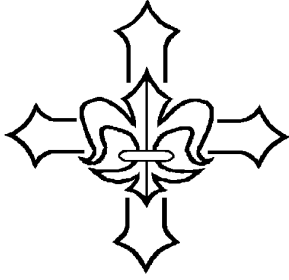

Four months ago I started a monthly women's discussion group as a possible way to reach women who might not be ready to set foot in a church but were interested in finding out more. Meetings, held at a pub in Elsworth, start at 7.30pm and comprise a fixed-price two course supper at 8pm, a Christian speaker at 9pm and discussion from 9.30 to 10pm.
